

New Report Shows Arts Education's Impact on Students

EdVestors — in collaboration with Boston Public Schools Visual and Performing Arts Department, local and national funders, arts organizations and community members — released "The Arts Advantage: Impacts of Arts Education on Boston Students." Supported by The Barr Foundation, this longitudinal research study encompasses an analysis of 11 years of arts education data and district data regarding student engagement, school climate and traditional academic outcomes to examine arts educational impacts for students, and includes over 1,500 variables and 615,000 student-level observations. Application Deadline Approaches for Florida Folklife Apprenticeship Program

The Florida Department of State invites eligible masters and apprentices to participate in the state's **folklife apprenticeship program**. The program annually supports the sharing of folklife, or Florida's living traditions, within communities across the state. These awards fund three-, six-, or eight-month periods of study between a master and apprentice artist, which enables them to work together to share traditional knowledge, skills and techniques. **Deadline to apply: May 15**!

Artists and Designers Meld Artistic and Scientific Methods for Media Arts Exhibit

The Art±Bio Collaborative — an artist- and scientist-led nonprofit organization — teamed up with artists and art and design students studying BioAesthetics and BioArt, as well as members of the BioMedia Lab, for the Art±Biology Methods Project. Part of the virtual 2021 Cambridge Science Festival, throughout April, project artist and designers created biologically inspired art and shared their artistic methods. From observations and questions, to hypotheses, experiments and the dissemination of results, this engaging mixed media collaborative project is now available to explore through the virtual **Art±Biology Methods Exhibition**.
