Information About State and Local Relief Spending Shows Emerging Trends

On Feb. 14, Education Commission of the States shared a new post on EdNote, 4 Ways States Are Using American Rescue Plan Funds. The post from the Council of Chief State School Officers outlined trends captured by that organization's first review of state plans. Four major themes included spending on unfinished learning; student and educator mental health, well-being and connectedness; educator recruitment and retention; and data and funding sustainability.

ECS is also tracking relief spending using tools from partner organizations:

- FutureEd's state plan tracking spreadsheet;
- EdRecoveryHub website from the Collaborative for Student Success and Center for Reinventing Public Education, which shares notable practices in states and school districts;
- Burbio's ESSER III spending tracker for school districts;
- ARPA Utilization Data by State tool from the Council of State
 Governments, which captures spending from the State and Local Fiscal
 Recovery Fund. This tool includes funding allocated to other entities like
 state arts agencies.

Study Group Opportunity for Music Educators

The Berklee Institute for Arts Education and Special Needs will offer its free virtual study group for music educators to help them better reach every student in lesson, ensemble and class settings. The study group will take place in April and May 2022, and participants can attend synchronously or asynchronously. Participation is free; advance registration is required.

Grant Opportunity to Support CA Documentary

Storytellers

California Humanities invites **applications** for the 2022 round of CDP NextGen grants to support California's next generation of documentary storytellers ages 18 and under.

California-based nonprofit organizations and public agencies — including schools and libraries — with track records in youth media programming may apply for grants up to \$15,000 to provide training to emerging media makers in the creation of short, insightful nonfiction films and/or podcasts that tell original stories about life in California today. Applications are due by **March 1.**

Applications Open for Theatre Scholarships

American Theatre Wing, founder of the Tony Awards and home of the Obie Awards, is accepting applications for the 2022 **Andrew Lloyd Webber Initiative University Scholarships**. Established in 2016, these scholarships offer public high school seniors \$10,000 per year, renewable for four years, to pursue theatre studies at the university level. Applicants from populations historically underrepresented in the theatre industry and applicants interested in behind-the-scenes disciplines – stage management, lighting design, playwriting, arts administration and more – are urged to apply. **Applications** are due on **Monday, Feb. 28**.

Updated Digest of Education Statistics Released

On Feb. 10, the Institute of Education Statistics released the **Digest of Education Statistics 2020**, a comprehensive statistical reference for all levels of education in the United States. Key findings include:

- Due to the coronavirus pandemic, among adults who had children under age 18 enrolled in a public or private school, 67% reported in September 2020 that classes had moved to a distance learning format using online resources.
- Total public elementary and secondary school enrollment was projected to reach 56.4 million in fall 2020 according to projections calculated prior to the coronavirus pandemic. About 50.7 million of these students were projected to enroll in public elementary and secondary schools and 5.7

- million were projected to enroll in private elementary and secondary schools.
- Fall enrollment in degree-granting postsecondary institutions decreased by 7% between 2010 (21.0 million) and 2019 (19.6 million).

New School Mental Health Report Card Highlights Challenges

America's School Mental Health Report Card from the Hopeful Futures Campaign outlines recent statistics related to youth mental health:

- More than one in three high school students reported persistent feelings of sadness or hopelessness in 2019.
- 20% of students said they had seriously considered suicide.
- Emergency department visits for children ages 5-11 increased by 24% from 2019 to 2020, with visits for youth ages 12-17 increasing by 31% in the same time period.

The report also compiles state-level statistics and policies related to school mental health professionals, school-family-community partnerships, staff training and more.
