### Juvenile Justice Blog Series: Partnerships Key to Meaningful Arts Learning

### National Art Education Association and Young Audiences Arts for Learning Among ED Grantees

The U.S. Department of Education has announced its latest round of grantees in the Assistance for Arts Education program. Among the awardees are AEP partner organizations: the National Art Education Association (NAEA) – representing a coalition that also includes the National Dance Education Organization, Educational Theatre Association, National Association for Music Education, and New York City Department of Education's Office of Arts and Special Projects – and Young Audiences Arts for Learning. The awards for these organizations total \$17.7 million.

## TN Arts Organizations and Department of Education to Conduct Statewide Study of Arts Education Access

The CMA Foundation and Mr. Holland's Opus Foundation are partnering with the Tennessee Department of Education to conduct a statewide arts education landscape analysis. The **State of the Arts Study** will be free to each of Tennessee's 147 school districts and will focus on indicators of quality arts education programs based on the Mr. Holland's Opus Foundation's Music Education District Support Services framework. The department of education will also create a State of the Arts: Arts Education Network to connect arts education stakeholders throughout Tennessee.

### Representative Bonamici Introduces Historic Arts Education Bill

On Friday, Oct. 15, Representative Suzanne Bonamici (D-OR) introduced the Arts Education for All Act in the U.S. House of Representatives. Rep. Bonamici hosted an event featuring student performances to kick off the bill, the most comprehensive ever introduced into Congress.

### University of South Florida Receives Federal Grant to Strengthen Arts Education Programming

The Race, Equity, Arts and Cultural History project (REACH) will focus on teaching about race, equity and cultural history through arts education and is funded by an \$8.5 million dollar grant from the U.S. Department of Education. Denise Davis-Cotton, director of the University of South Florida's Center for Partnerships in Arts Integrated Teaching, will serve as the principal director. Through REACH, educators and school leaders can participate in professional development opportunities and the project will also support the development of creative and inclusive curricula to engage students. REACH will be implemented in several model schools across K-12, with a goal of developing a national model.
