




# A Year of **Refinement**







#### **Annual Survey**

AEP conducted the third Annual Survey for partners, affiliates and others in our network to provide honest feedback on AEP's work and relationships. 63 participants completed the survey over a two-month window. This survey will be conducted bi-annually going forward.

#### **Annual Convening**

This year as a part of collaboration with the OF/BY/FOR ALL Change Network, AEP focused on fostering relationships with policymakers at the Annual Convening. The event attracted 184 attendees, including 11 staff members and 44 non-staff speakers Sept. 12-13 in Pittsburgh. This was the first Annual Convening for 56% of registrants. This year's event also included a STEAM ancillary event in collaboration with ECS.

In the post-event survey, 94% of participants felt the goals they had for attending the Annual Convening were met.





#### **ArtScan**

In April, AEP released the annual update to ArtScan. Some notable updates include three states adopting STEAM or arts diploma seals, and five states who adopted alternative options to earning required arts credits for high school graduation.

**96%** who used ArtScan within the past year agreed or strongly agreed they use ArtScan to feel informed about state-level arts education policies in their own contexts and across states.


## **D** 1,887 page visits **Creative Pathways: Arts Education in** Juvenile Justice Systems

In July, AEP released the **Cultivating a Sustainable Educator Community** resource webpage. The page provides information on arts teacher retention, preparation, recruitment and development as they relate to states with arts teacher shortages





#### ArtsEdSearch

The AEP team, in collaboration with consultant Asif Majid, reimagined updates to **ArtsEdSearch**. ArtsEdSearch reviews and research updates have paused for the 2024-25 year until the updates are complete. The AEP team and Asif facilitated focus groups with internal and external partners to finalize a purpose statement to guide the next phase of work. AEP expects to pilot a new review process in 2025.



#### **AEP Hosted Meetings**

#### **Partnership Meetings**


This year, AEP hosted three in-person and virtual Partnership Meetings for over 50 attendees. In the virtual meeting, we heard from three students about their research on the arts and mental health.

For the first time, AEP hosted two in-person Partnership Meetings. The first meeting was held in Denver to build relationships in anticipation for local planning committee recruitment. The second was held in Pittsburgh alongside the Annual Convening and focused on fostering partnership through connection activities. In the Annual Survey, respondents chose reasons why they attended Partnership Meetings. In order of most chosen to least, participants indicated they attended to:

- **1** Feel knowledgeable about the work of other partners and affiliates.
- **2** Be aware of AEP's work, products and services.
- **3 Connect** with other partners/affiliates.
- 4 Connect with other AEP staff.

#### **Town Halls for Local Arts Education Supervisors**

AEP supported the Town Hall co-chairs to host three Town Halls for Local Arts Education Supervisors. These virtual meetings convened over 150 participants to talk about the issues facing school districts and programs. Across the three webinars, we learned about course code systems, data collection limitations, the Connected Arts Network and educator burnout and self-care.





#### **Working Groups**

#### **Arts Education Policy Working Group**

After consulting the policy working group chairs, this working group is now dissolved. There are other groups outside of AEP with similar membership and focus, making this group duplicative. The Town Hall for Local Arts Education Supervisors, led by volunteer co-chairs Latasha Casterlow-Lalla, Lindsay Halford, Mario Rossero and Nina Unitas continued to explore topics of interest to local arts education supervisors.

This year, AEP worked with the Data Working Group's co-chairs to finalize the data report draft. The Data Working Group first met in 2023 to investigate arts education data collection and reporting at the national, state, regional and local levels. The group's goal was to discover where data are being collected and reported and where gaps in data still exist.

#### **Equity Working Group**


After consulting with the chairs, this working group will be dissolved. The group's initial goals have been met, and no new projects have surfaced to continue the working group.

#### Partnerships With Higher Ed: Policy, Programs and Research




